The Team Endowment Program gives a community the ability to financially support a competitive youth shooting sports team. Over 3,000 youth shooting teams have an endowment and they grow the endowment through donations, fundraising and investment earnings. A team can then request a grant of 5% of their endowment balance once each year to pay for team expenses. There are no fees associated with a MidwayUSA Foundation Team Endowment.





We started our program with 12 kids in a barn. Our success was limited by facilities, equipment and supplies. Our rifles were borrowed. The team's ammunition came from our personal supply. And then we found out about the MidwayUSA Foundation. Their matching program and incentives eliminated many of the obstacles we faced. Knowing we had the support of the MidwayUSA Foundation allowed us to dream big. It helped us to realize the limitless potential that became The X Count. Now we have 50 plus athletes representing fifteen different schools and they can train year round. We have a twenty lane electronic target facility.

Without the MidwayUSA Foundation we would have been discouraged by the obstacles we faced, instead we saw only possibilities. Our athletes are like a family and spend hundreds of hours shooting each year. When they graduate they come back, often. For most the memories of the rifle team are the most important of their high school career. They joke about sending their own children to rifle and coaching together. GRANTS

The MidwayUSA Foundation offers annual cash grants to participating Teams, Agencies, and Donor Designated accounts of 5% of their endowment balance to pay for operating expenses. Grant awards have grown dramatically, rising from just \$14,000 in 2010 to over \$3.7 million in 2016. Over the next five years cash grants are expected to grow steadily to a projected \$8.2 million.

The MidwayUSA Foundation also offers non-cash grants of product that help participating Teams and Agencies grow their endowments. They can use the product to conduct fundraisers. Since 2012, when fundraising items were first offered, the Foundation has provided nearly \$3.5 Million worth of product for teams to use in their successful fundraising efforts.






