MIDWAYUSA FOUNDATION NOW ACCEPTING CASH GRANT APPLICATIONS FROM YOUTH SHOOTING TEAMS

Columbia, **MO** – Youth shooting teams across the nation can now apply for a cash grant through the MidwayUSA Foundation to assist in covering team expenses. Every team in their Team Endowment Program that holds a balance is eligible to apply, once per year. Applicants must complete the MidwayUSA Foundation grant application, found online at <u>midwayusafoundation.org/teamgrants</u>. In August, the MidwayUSA Foundation paid over \$1.7 million to 534 shooting teams.

Youth shooting teams of all disciplines can receive 5% of their MidwayUSA Foundation Team Endowment balance to use for shooting team expenses, such as ammunition, travel, entry fees, uniforms, targets, and more. Right now, over 2,000 teams are eligible with a potential payout of more than \$4.1 million. The deadline to apply for a team cash grant is December 15 but teams are encouraged to apply now and their payout will be adjusted on the deadline. Teams interested in their eligibility can email grants@midwayusafoundation.org or they can check their Team Endowment balance on the MidwayUSA Foundation website. Every team in the program has a webpage that lists their fund balance, funding to date, team contacts, and more. Supporters can also donate through that page.
